June 18th Meeting

We had about 30 members attending the meeting and 3 called in on Zoom. The main event of the evening was the Club Auction which included many interesting and valuable lots. 55 Of the 74 lots were sold for a total of \$1594 and, together with strong raffle sales, nearly \$1650 was raised for the club.

Marc Dochez presented a short "Show & Tell" piece on two books he has recently acquired. The first was an excellent study titled "Understanding the Grills Stamps of the US" by Jan Hofmeyr. The embossed grills were introduced in 1867 as an early effort to foil counterfeiters and forgers. The second book concerned "The Reprints, Counterfeits and Forgeries of Mexico's First Design—Stamps of the 1856-61 & 1867 Issue" by Marc E Gonzales. (Our) Marc said that this was a difficult and complex area for collectors and this work was both clear, well illustrated and useful. It had already helped to identify a few forgeries in his collection of Mexican stamps.

George Struble showed members his very nice medal from his recent trip to Switzerland which combined exhibiting at a major stamp show and a family vacation.

George writes: The stamp show was BERNABA; it was in Bern, and was Switzerland's highest-level stamp show. They have those once every six years! I showed my two exhibits "Getting Swiss Airmail off the Ground" and "SCADTA Mail To and From



Switzerland." The SCADTA exhibit earned a Gold award (remember that that is the second highest level, below Large Gold). The other exhibit earned a Vermeil award, its lowest result for a long time. I learn that all my first flight covers are out of style now; the judges prefer commercial i.e. non-philatelic covers. That reinforces my decision to leave both exhibits *contd*.



July is a Big Month for the USPS.

This month marks the **250th Anniversary** of the founding of the US Post Office. On July 23rd 2025 a pane of 20 interconnected stamps will be released in a sheet titled "250 Years of Delivery". The stamps show a bird's eye view of a mail carriers progress through a town and as the seasons change from top left to bottom right.



On the same day the USPS will hold a first day of issue ceremony in Washington DC for the new Benjamin Franklin N.D. stamp. These will be issued in a 32 page Prestige Booklet (below) titled "Putting a Face on the American Experience".


The new Franklin stamp is a modern interpretation of the 1847 5c issue (Scott #1).

The latest issue of Linn's Stamp News dated July 14th 2025 described the release of an advanced copy of the 250th Anniversary edition of Publication 100, "The USPS: An American History."



It marks a significant milestone in the organization's journey from its colonial origins to its modern service. In it, the outgoing Postmaster General Louis DeJoy describes recent initiatives, innovations and strategic directions for the USPS. The mission, he says, remains much the same—to provide all Americans, in all areas and communities, with access to prompt, reliable and efficient services.

Rate Increase. One of the last acts in its first 250 years of service is to increase the cost a postage on July 13th for a First Class letter by 5c to 78c, with 29c for an extra ounce and international letters to \$1.70.

The 250th Anniversary made me curious about the origins of the postal service in America. According to Wikipedia sources the focus in the early years of the North American colonies was getting mail to and from England. Attempts were made to set up a postal service between the main colonies but were largely haphazard and disjointed.

A central postal organization was set up in1691 by the British Crown in the person of Thomas Neale who was given *letters patent* (a form of state monopoly) to establish offices in the colonies to receive and deliver mail for sums of money. The first postal service was established in 1692. Rates of postage were fixed but the system is said to have been imperfect. Neale's patent expired in 1710 and the Parliament extended the English postal system to the colonies. The chief office was established in New York and regular packets (mail ships) carried letters across the Atlantic.

At the time of the American Revolution there was a greater need to carry news, pamphlets, orders as well as letters and a new and better postal service was necessary. At the Second Continental Congress the United States Post Office was created by decree on <u>July 25 1775</u>. It was headed briefly by Benjamin Franklin who had previously been a colonial postmaster. He, along with others were responsible for developing a new postal system as an alternative to the Crown Post.

The Post Office Department (USPOD) was created in 1792 based on Constitutional authority empowering Congress to establish Post Offices and Post Roads. Samuel Osgood was appointed the first Post Master General. The 1792 law provided the entire country with low cost access to information on public affairs and established a right to personal privacy.



The cabinet level USPOD was replaced in 1971by an independent US Postal Service under an Act signed by President Nixon.
